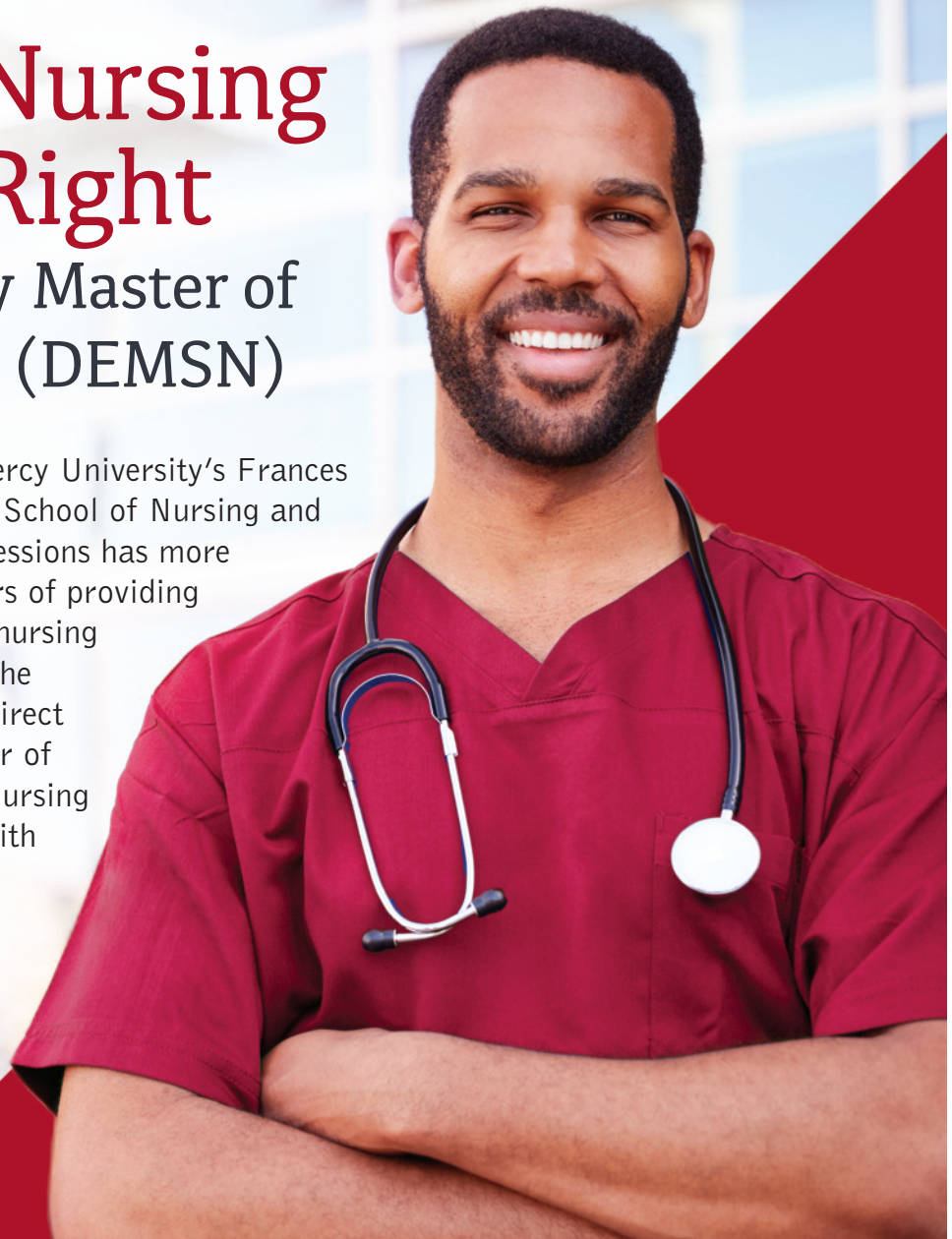

- Demonstrate professional and social responsibility for self, individuals, family, and community grounded in the GMercyU tradition and within the context of a multicultural society
- Apply leadership skills in graduate nursing roles and deliver high quality nursing care

Prerequisite Courses



The general education courses you took during your previous bachelor's program may transfer to our DEMSN program. If your bachelor's program lacked a strong science component, or if you graduated more than five years ago, you may need to make up gaps in your knowledge with prerequisite courses. Courses must be completed within the last seven years at the time of admission.

REQUIRED PREREQUISITE COURSES INCLUDE:

- **Nutrition** – taught by a registered dietician – 3 credits
- **Developmental Psychology** with a focus across the lifespan – 3 credits
 - **Statistics or Biostatistics** – 3 credits
 - **Anatomy and Physiology I** (Lecture and Lab) – 4 credits
 - **Anatomy and Physiology II** (Lecture and Lab) – 4 credits
 - **Microbiology with lab** – 4 credits
 - **General Chemistry II course** (Lecture and Lab) or equivalent – 4 credits

90% of our accelerated nursing graduates complete at least one prerequisite course at GMercyU. Our classes cover critical knowledge in science and general education with a focus on the specific needs of nurses.

PREREQUISITE COURSES TAKE FIVE TO EIGHT WEEKS TO COMPLETE. TOPICS INCLUDE:

- **Nutrition** (6-week course)
- **Developmental Psychology** (5-week course)
- **Statistics** (5-week course)
- **Microbiology** plus lab (8-week course)
- **Anatomy & Physiology I** plus lab (8-week course)
- **Anatomy & Physiology II** plus lab (8-week course)
- **Chemistry For Allied Health Professions** plus lab (8-week course)

You can take all courses, or just the courses missing from your previous bachelor's program.



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Licensure: This program was designed to meet the licensure requirements of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. 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Admission Requirements

CRITERIA FOR ACCEPTANCE into the Frances M. Maguire School of Nursing and Health Professions for Gwynedd Mercy University's DEMSN program, includes:

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university
- GPA Requirements: A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 based on the last 60 credit hours of college coursework, including graduate coursework, attempted and accepted. Competitive candidates will have an undergraduate GPA of 3.2 or higher. A minimum GPA of 3.3 is required for science courses
- Two satisfactory letters of recommendation that can be from the following: an academic professional; a healthcare provider with whom the student has worked or volunteered with; a current supervisor
- Resume or CV
- Essay (750 words or less) addressing your motivation to pursue the profession of nursing and why you have chosen to pursue your MSN; additional information can also be prior work or volunteer experience in healthcare; an example that demonstrates team leadership
- In-person or virtual interview
- All science prerequisite courses, and Nutrition, Statistics, and Developmental Psychology must be completed within the last seven years.

ONCE YOU ARE ADMITTED TO THE PROGRAM YOU WILL NEED TO:

- Pass a criminal background and child abuse records check
- Undergo a drug screening and FBI fingerprinting
- Provide a certificate of health from a family physician or nurse practitioner that includes immunization information
- Obtain a yearly flu vaccination, COVID vaccination, and PPD screening
- Provide proof of CPR certification, liability insurance, and personal health insurance

THESE REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET BEFORE BEGINNING YOUR DEMSN PROGRAM.
